- I fulfill responsibilities typically associated with both the product owner and scrum master roles in the Agile software development methodology, with probably a roughly 80%/20% focus, respectively. I often run sprint planning meetings for our three scrum teams (~6 developers per team), refinement meetings, and an occasional daily standup or retro meeting, but most of my day-to-day focus is on backlog management.
- Assist stakeholders with requirement generation and user story refinement, build product backlog items (PBIs) for our developers and organize them into epics, sequence and prioritize work in our development backlog, and serve as the primary communication bridge between developers and stakeholders for requirement-related questions. Because I have a technical background, I am also often involved in the technical design decision-making process as I work with our senior devs to build out larger efforts in our backlog.
- Interface with other members of the wider Program Office (in the technical DoD Acquisitions sense of that term), such as the program management team, the functional testing team, cybersecurity personnel (ISSM/ISSO) and pen testers, engineering oversight personnel, our cloud hosting provider, etc.

- Our project had multiple parallel dev teams. As one of the team leads, I helped our PM do backlog refinement, size work items, and sequence things to avoid dependency in our sprints.
- I also coordinated all the work for our sub-team of ~5 developers and ran the sprint planning meetings for our sub-team. (All this was on top of my normal software development responsibilities; I was still an active developer).
